Motorhome Winter maintenance guide



10 ways you can maintain your motorhome this season

1. Tyres

Check tyre pressure and consider getting winter tyres. Tyres can retain moisture, creating rust or rot; one final clean before packing them away can avoid this.

2. Paintwork

Touch up your motorhome with a new coat of paint to prevent rust.

3. Awning

Extend your awning and check it's clean and dry before packing it away - avoids unpleasant smells when you bring your motorhome back out.

4. Ticking over

Start your vehicle once a month and let it run for more than 15 minutes.

5. Top-ups

Don't forget to charge your battery, top up oil and lubricate any moving parts – maintains quality during storage.





6. Drain away

Drain all storage tank water (waste tank too), and check taps are free from any surplus water (a short drive can help review this). This helps when temperatures drop, protecting all tanks and pipes. Alternatively, you could insulate your pipes.

7. Keep it tidy

Keep cupboards and cooking areas clean.

8. Circulation

Keep good air circulation inside vehicle - leave cupboard and fridge doors open.

9. Cover up

Protect your motorhome with breathable tarpaulin or a specialised cover.

10. Avoid rust

Use WD-40 or thin oil to prevent rust.
